

Takahē Newsletter

Term 3 2018



Welcome back to Room Takahē and Term 3 2018. Our class will continue to have two teachers this term. I, Miss van Beek will be in the class in the morning until lunch time taking Literacy, Mathematics and some of the Inquiry Topics. Whaea Poihaere will come into the class after lunch to teach Te Reo, Sports, Art and Inquiry while I am taking children for Reading Discovery. Whaea Poihaere will also be covering the release that I have and any days when I have Reading Discovery training.

As it is a winter term children are not required to wear their Otakiri Blue hat in the playground. As the weather can be unpredictable children should come with adequate clothing for the changing weather. Woollen hats and gloves can be worn outside but children will be asked to remove them and put them in their bag during class time. It is important that all clothing, including shoes and socks are named so they can be quickly returned if found in the playground. We recommend that all children have a named water bottle daily. Please ensure that if you are packing packaged food for morning teas and lunches that your child can open them independently and if they have a yoghurt pot please send a spoon.



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This term for Maths we are focussing on Number strategies, finding the difference/subtraction. We will also be exploring money, length, mass, volume and capacity. Your child has a Mathletics password in their Homework book. Please encourage your child to go on Mathletics at home. An additional 10 to 20 minutes 2 to 3 times weekly will help your child's progress immensely, we have seen the results of the use of Mathletics on building knowledge and confidence. Mathletics enables your child to further practise number knowledge and skills (this is also available on APP

based devices).

For Writing it is expected that Takahē children will write many sentences daily on a variety of topics following a writing structure aligned with the style of text. We will be developing our ability to write poetry, procedural and recount texts with themes of Space, construction instructions and read texts. There is weekly spelling for Homework. The spelling is divided into 5 words to learn each week. This term has been set up ahead of time but students do not need to learn ahead of the week we are in. However if they have not successfully mastered all the words from earlier weeks they can continue to practise these words to master them. A good knowledge of spelling can make it easier and faster for children to write as they do not need to consider how each word is spelt.



We will continue to develop Reading skills by reading and listening to a variety of books. Your child will bring home a reader from Monday through to Thursday each week; readers need to be returned each day. Junior and School Journals will be read over a week. Most weeks your child will have a comprehension worksheet to go with one of their reading texts - they will have had time to do these in class but may choose to finish them at home. They are designed to help them engage with the topics, vocabulary and ideas from the texts. When listening to your child read each night ask them to answer questions about the vocabulary used in the text and what it means or another word that could be used in its place. This will help to engage them with the text and develop their vocabulary and understanding of new words. It is important that they are able to make links between what is written and what they know, not just to read the words on the page. The computer programme Reading Eggs/Reading Eggspress which your child has a password for should also be used regularly to develop understanding of sounds, letters, sentence formations and comprehension skills. Reading Eggspress Library also has hundreds of books on it which your child can access to read (this is also available on APP based devices).

Fridays will be very busy as we have Waiata, Library/Computer work and Golden Time. On alternate Fridays we will also have Assembly. In Te Reo Maori, the children will have an opportunity to continue building their skills in the topics of "Nga Tau (Numeracy)" and "Hauora (Health)" This term we are preparing for our annual Matariki Dinner which is on the 3rd of August (5 - 8pm). There will be more details about this when planning has been completed. Regarding the Library, children will be issued with up to two library books which can be returned at any stage during the next week. Books must be returned if children wish to get new books out. We will have ICT time on some Thursdays and Fridays.
